

RCC Poll Review: March 12, 2002

The poll game continues. During the first week of March, Ukraine's major polling agencies released fresh nationwide public opinion poll results, which include all competing 33 parties and blocs. Figures represent respondents who indicated that they will vote on Election Day. Results for the leading parties and blocs are provided in the table below.

Socis. Poll conducted February 22 – 26. Respondents: 2200. Margin of error: +/- 3%. Results released on March 7, 2002. The results for Yednist and Democratic Bloc are included in the line for "Others." Poll commissioned by *Kyiv Center for Political Research & Conflict Studies*.

UISS – *Ukrainian Institute for Social Research & The Social Monitoring Center*. Poll conducted February 22 – 24. Respondents: 2013. Margin of error: +/- 1.3 to +/- 2.2%. Results released on March 1, 2002.

Razumkov Center – *Ukrainian Center for Economic and Political Studies*. Poll conducted February 28 – March 6. Respondents: 2010. 4.8% of respondents indicated that they will not participate in the elections. Margin of error: +/-2.3%. Results released on March 8, 2002.

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
