Vybory 2002: One Outcome Scenario

The following table has been compiled from two separate sources. One source is *Fond Obschestvenehe Mnenya* (FOM) a Russian polling firm, that works closely with *Fond Effektyvnoyi Polityky* (FEP), run by Vladimir Putin's PR guru, Hleb Pavlovsky. They provide the data for the % of Popular Vote. The other source is a joint Ukraine-EU website devoted to analyzing the battles for seats in single mandate districts. They provide the estimated number of MPs, and their party/bloc membership, elected in the single mandate races. Taken together, the two provide one possible scenario for the total number of seats for each party and bloc.
